Scheme	Support	Eligibility
Small Business Survival Fund	<p>The rapid adaption payment provides:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • up to \$1,000 for businesses with one employee (FTE) and • up to \$5,000 for other eligible businesses to offset costs incurred in adapting their current business model to suit restrictions. 	<p>This initiative is available to Northern Territory (NT) businesses that meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a legal entity and holder of a valid Australian business number (ABN) as at 23 March 2020, and • a Territory enterprise, and • usually operates in one of the industry sectors affected by the social gathering restrictions announced on 22 March 2020 and 24 March 2020, and / or • has been significantly impacted by the physical distancing requirements in response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic - for example, staffing, turnover.

The Northern Territory Government have several programs that support sport within the community. Examples of programs which may assist your club if you have been heavily impacted by COVID-19 are below.

Scheme	Support	Eligibility
Business Recovery - Not for Profit/Community Organisations	<p>Grants of up to \$100,000 will be given to Northern Territory (NT) not-for-profit and community organisations to engage local businesses to do repairs, renovations and upgrades to their property and facilities. These are for permanent physical improvements to land and / or buildings.</p>	<p>You can apply if you are a not-for-profit or community organisation operating in the NT in either owned or leased premises.</p> <p>Each organisation can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • apply once for the program and • be able to complete up to three jobs under the one application.

	The first \$50,000 will be paid as a grant without you needing to co-contribute.	
Community Benefit Fund	<p>You can apply for minor community grants to fund a project in its entirety or for a portion.</p> <p>Applications may also be made for multiple purposes. Preference will be given to applications that include co-contributions.</p> <p>Eligible organisations can apply for amounts up to \$15,000.</p>	<p>If you want to apply for a minor community grant in the Northern Territory (NT), you must be either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an NT based non-profit community organisation • an NT regional council. <p>You must be incorporated under one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the Associations Act (NT) • the Corporations Act 2001 (Commonwealth) • the Corporations (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) Act 2006 (Commonwealth) • any other Act of Parliament. <p>Organisations must be not-for-profit and have a physical presence in the NT.</p>
Sport and Active Recreation Grants	Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to help organisations meet unforeseeable equipment expenses and structural repairs.	<p>Organisations can apply for repair or replacement of damaged and or stolen facilities or equipment.</p> <p>To be eligible an organisation must be all of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a sport or active recreation organisation based on the definition in the below program guidelines • based in the Northern Territory (NT) • currently registered as an incorporated body with Licensing NT or hold another comparable legal status • a not-for-profit organisation (exception for regional councils) • compliant with Licensing NT or other relevant authority • able to provide formal quotes for assessment.
